# BOBCAT AT DEVIL'S LAKE

## Bobcat or Mountain Lion?

If you are every lucky enough to see a bobcat in the wild, here's some ways to help you know if it's a bobcat or the much larger mountain lion (also known as a cougar).

### Size

- Bobcats are about 30 inches long and weigh between 15 to 35 pounds.
- Mountain lions are usually 52 to 54 inches long and weigh between 100 and 175 pounds.

### Tail

- Bobcats have a short bobtail that's about five inches long.
- Mountain lions have a long and cylindrical tail with a dark tip. The tail is usually 30 to 36 inches long.

### Color

- Bobcats are an orangish color and have black spots.
- Mountain lions are uniform in color and have a tawny coloration (a tan orangish-brownish color).



## ▶ CHARITABLE GIVING TIMES ARE A CHANGIN' IN 2020

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security or CARES Act, signed into law in late March, includes a provision that will make it easier for many taxpayers to receive at least a small tax break for charitable giving once again, something they may have not been able to do since 2018.

The CARES Act included so many components, including stimulus checks, small-business loans, and the pause on Required Minimum Distributions from IRAs and other retirement accounts for 2020, that some of the provisions related to charitable giving got lost in the shuffle! A key one is that, starting for the 2020 tax year (the return you'll file in 2021) and going forward, taxpayers who claim the standard deduction will be able to take a new above-the-line deduction for cash gifts to qualified charities (this typically means a charity that is registered as a 501(c)(3)). This means their charitable contributions up to the \$300 limit will reduce their adjusted gross incomes.

Now don't get too excited: the deduction limit is fairly small, just \$300, regardless of tax-filing status. But the above-the-line detail

helps ensure that the many taxpayers who recently may not have been able to claim a tax benefit for charitable contributions may now be able to deduct at least some of their contributions. Since the new tax laws went into effect in 2018, many fewer taxpayers have itemized their deductions. Without itemized deductions, including charitable contributions, they couldn't get credit for their charitable gifts. That appears to have had a chilling effect on charitable contributions in 2018 (it's too early to say whether that falloff in giving persisted into 2019).

If you've been claiming the standard deduction recently, you may have gotten a bit lax about saving receipts for charitable contributions. But for 2020, you have an incentive to hang on to proof of your contributions - at least up to the \$300 limit! If 2020 has been good to you despite the challenges that the Coronavirus has presented, why not remember the Friends in your year-end charitable contributions! Oh, I almost forgot, the obligatory disclaimer: this article should not be perceived as tax advice; consult your personal tax advisor for more details.
