Happy New Year! Unfortunately, for the outdoor enthusiasts who enjoy cross country skiing and snowshoeing, the weather in Southern Wisconsin has not been cooperative for the first half of January. 
Life is interesting: You don't ever want to stop learning!

END OF FISCAL YEAR FINANCIALS

The FRIENDS fiscal year ended October 31, 2022, and the new financial sheets have been uploaded to our website **friendsofdevilslake.org**. They can be found by hovering over the "About" button on the top right of the picture on our main page and clicking on "Overview" in the box that opens. Scroll down the Overview page to review the Financial Statements for the Nov 2021 – Oct 2022 fiscal year.

Our income for last year (excluding the Interpretive Center project) was \$161,966.42, and our expenses were \$107,114.08, for net income of \$54,852.34. General donations were \$16,468.27. Our main sources of income are firewood and merchandise sales, memberships, donations, paver sales, bank interest, and grants. After operational expenses, we fund Music in the Park events, volunteer and member events, supplies for graffiti removal, torchlit hike events, and much more. This year we also funded removal of a paved walkway in the north shore picnic area that was too close to a burial mound and new sand for one of the south shore volleyball courts.

We applied for and received a 2022-2024 Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Friends Grant, a 2022 Friends of Wisconsin State Parks Incentive Grant, and a 2022 Friends Heritage Trust Grant. These grants are used to fund maintenance and improvements at the park, including the new fish interpretive panels you may have noticed on the north and south shores. We have already applied for a 2023 Friends Heritage Trust Grant and continue to look for opportunities for funds that can be used to improve the park.



Make a difference: JOIN THE CAMPAIGN

The Campaign for America's State Park, energized by a \$1 million donation from the Devil's Lake Concessions Board in mid-2022, is mobilizing volunteers to raise funds for an \$18 million Interpretive Center. "We're getting into the community, building awareness and interacting with potential donors," said Bernadette Greenwood, co-chair of the capital campaign. "Citizens are reacting positively to our presentations and the need for a new center to teach about the park's culture and history." Volunteers have also taken the campaign into the park and community at events. The Concept of Friluftsliv

Welcome to January and it seems like we've been stuck in gray, cloudy days for weeks now. All the wonderful snow the area received in December has melted into icy, crusty layers with lots of icy patches underneath making it a bit of a challenge to get out onto the trails. Nothing about our recent weather makes you want to get up and get outside, which is why my husband and I have been practicing the Scandinavian concept of **friluftsliv** (pronounced *free-loofts-liv*) which translates roughly to 'open-air living.' This concept is widely popular across the Nordic countries where, despite freezing temperatures and very few hours of sunlight throughout the winter months, getting outside and embracing the outdoors is an important part of life, not only in the winter months, but all year around.

It's not a secret that getting outdoors in nature is good for your mental and physical health. From the serotonin boosting effects of sunlight exposure to the impact a walk in a natural setting can have on your mood. No matter where you get outside, whether it's in a



place like Devil's Lake or your local green space, being outside can provide a whole host of benefits. Not only does getting out reconnect us with nature, but it's also been proven to reduce levels of anxiety, stress and depression. A recent study found that spending at least 120 minutes a week in nature leads to a greater well-being and makes us happier. Although, when the weather isn't the best, like it's pouring rain, there's gray skies for days or the temperatures are below zero, and you'd rather stay inside and enjoy coffee while reading, embracing the concept of **friluftsliv** is all about putting those hesitations behind you. There's a couple of Norwegian sayings I try to remember when the weather just doesn't motivate me to get outside. One saying is "Det finnes ikke dårlig vær, bare dårlig klær!" which translates to "There is no bad weather, only bad clothes!" And the other is "Ut på tur, aldri sur", directly translating to "Out on hike, never in a bad mood". That last saying I needed recently when my husband and I looked at each other, neither of us motivated to get out. We then

reminded each other the key part of **friluftsliv** is making the most of the outdoors no matter what the weather conditions are, and we were rewarded by the most beautiful hoar frost covering the top of the east bluff and a peak of the sun while we were out! It was a wonderful reminder of why it's important to get out because you'll never know what you'll find, and you are often rewarded with the beauty nature has to offer when you do.

Whether or not you're an "outdoorsy" person, making time for the outdoors is a great way to embrace these Wisconsin winter months. Here's some tips on how to embrace the winter and start your own **friluftsliv** practice this winter.

◆ Get outside rain, shine, cold or snow - No matter what the weather, **friluftsliv** is about getting outside and exploring what the natural world has to offer. It's all about adapting to what the weather gives you.

◆ Make the most of your lunch – Take some time to head outside during your lunch break. It could be for a short walk or just sitting outside for 10 to 15 minutes. Taking a break, especially when its outside, can help with your creativity and concentration.

◆ Think like an onion and wear layers – Spending time outside won't be fun if you're not properly dressed.

Wearing layers, especially if they are wicking layers, can make a difference in your enjoyment in the outdoors. Bring a backpack or bag along with you to carry extra layers to put on if you're feeling chilly or to take off when you start to warm up.

◆ Start a Sit Spot practice – If you're not quite up to being outside on days where the weather is less than perfect, you can still acquire the benefits of being outside by creating a sit spot practice. A sit spot is simply a favorite place in nature (or looking out a window at nature) that is visited regularly to cultivate awareness, expand senses and study patterns of local plants, birds, trees, and animals.

I hope you spend some time creating your own friluftsliv, whether it's on your own or with family and friends. If you're looking for some motivation to get you started, check out the DNR's events calendar at dnr.wisconsin.gov/events - we have events happening on the weekends here for you to participate in at Devil's Lake.
