Thanks for your continued support of the Friends, we couldn't do what we do without it!



## CHRISTMAS IN JULY

The Nature Center has experienced a surge of excitement, akin to Christmas in July. This excitement is from the Friends group, who successfully applied for and received the 2023 Incentive Grant from the Wisconsin State Parks Systems Friends Group. This annual grant, which matches funds, allows Wisconsin State Park Friends groups to request a specific amount of money and supplement it with funds from their own group. The Friends Group was awarded a generous sum of money this year, enabling us to introduce several new programs and purchase materials to enhance the interpretation program at the park throughout the summer.

In the upcoming months, we eagerly anticipate the arrival of various new program presenters, beginning in late July and continuing into August. We are particularly excited to welcome back the fun-loving Voyagers, presented by the Fox of the River Voyageur Canoe LLC. If you have not yet experienced the Fox of the River Voyageur Canoe programs, we wholeheartedly invite you to join us for a truly immersive, hands-on journey into the history and camaraderie of the fur trade era, focusing on the lives of the Voyageurs—the vibrant participants of that time. You'll have the extraordinary opportunity to paddle a 28-foot Voyageur canoe while delving into the Voyageur way of life. Let Jean Paul Pauquette and Jacques Largillier, our expert guides, transport you to the past.

Thanks to the grant, we are thrilled to host Shelley Mordini this summer. She will captivate us with her ghost tales about the town of Baraboo. Shelley is known for her unique tours around Baraboo, ranging from the haunted to the historic. When she joins us by the lake, she will gather us around the campfire and regale us with stories about the ghosts that have put the "boo" in Baraboo! Additionally, in August, we eagerly anticipate the visit of the Raptor Education Group, Inc. (REGI), who will bring their magnificent birds of prey. Prepare to be enthralled as you discover the essence of a raptor, listen to their fascinating stories, and learn how you can contribute to their preservation as an integral part of our ecosystem. However, the grant has not solely benefited the programs. The Nature Center has also been able to acquire several new items this summer, including digital

microscopes, underwater digital cameras, kick nets, and some new snowshoes to replace old pairs. These additions will greatly enhance the programs and events held at the nature center. I have previously written about the use of technology in our programs in Friends newsletters. Now, I know what you're thinking, kids (and adults) should put away their smartphones and tablets and just enjoy the outdoors. I once held the same perspective until I realized that it wasn't the most effective way to engage today's youth with the natural world.

Technology has become deeply ingrained in our lives and can serve as a powerful tool to connect visitors with nature. When I started incorporating technology into the programs, I ensured that it is not the sole focus but rather a seamlessly integrated tool, similar to any other resource we utilize. For instance, instead of using a magnifying lens to examine a bug or leaf, we now employ digital microscopes to closely observe nature. What I find truly remarkable is that integrating technology into our programs doesn't distract children; on the contrary, it enhances their engagement and


